

Degree program for:

BACHELOR of ARTS in ANTHROPOLOGY (students certified fall 2007 and after)

Candidates for the **Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology** must fulfill the University General Education Requirements (GER's) and the College of Liberal Arts requirements for graduation as described in the WSU Catalog. College requirements include one year of foreign language unless two years were taken in high school. Other University requirements include: 120 total credit hours of which 40 must be upper-division credits, the Writing Portfolio, and two Writing-in-the-Major [M] courses.

Major Requirements: A minimum of 34 ANTH credits is required. The student must achieve a grade of C- or better in each anthropology course. Required courses in Part I and Part II below cannot be taken pass/fail. Students cannot use ANTH 499 to fulfill a subdiscipline requirement (Part II below). A maximum of one 3-unit ANTH 499 can be utilized to fulfill an elective (Part III below). Students are strongly encouraged to obtain some field experience in one of the anthropological subdisciplines. A student can do this in a number of following: A. International Programs at WSU has several programs for students to spend a summer, semester or year abroad. These programs often do not cost much more than living in Pullman. Credit taken in WSU abroad programs can often apply towards the anthropology major. Courses taken abroad need to have Department Chair approval if they are to be included in the major. B. The Department of Anthropology offers field schools in archaeology during the summer (ANTH 399). C. ANTH 300 (Field Methods) or an independent field study locally or internationally with a faculty member (ANTH 499 Special Projects) are other possible alternatives.
