The program consists of 72 credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree. At least 34 credit hours must be devoted to the core program of 400 and 500 level courses, and must pertain to the student's chosen primary and secondary fields. Required courses within the core program must include two seminars (at least one in the primary field), two field courses (at least one of the primary field), Hist 580, Hist 595, and 20 sessions of the History Graduate Student/Faculty Colloquium and 20 hours of Hist 800. Students in U.S. history or Public history are required to take Hist 581. Pertinent courses taken for the master's degree may be included in the 34-credit core program. Nine credit hours may be taken outside the History Department. All students enrolled in at least 6 credits in a given semester must have a minimum of 3 credits in seminars, field courses, or research at the 500 or 800 levels. The remaining credit hours must consist of courses listed in the *Graduate School Bulletin*, a maximum of 9 credit hours of non-conjoint course work at the 300 or 400 level (of which a maximum of six credits may be taken at the 300 level) approved by the major professor, and allowed transfer credits for work taken elsewhere beyond the bachelor's degree. Students transferring hours from another school may use up to a maximum of 1/2 of the graded credits for the master's and doctoral degrees, see <http://www.gradsch.wsu.edu/programfaqs.html>. If required courses are not available during the student's tenure in the program, appropriate substitutes may be taken (Hist 597) with the approval of the major professor and the Director of Graduate Studies.
